SECTION 4: First-aid measures

4.1 Description of necessary first-aid measures

If inhaled

Move the victim into fresh air. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. If not breathing, give artificial respiration and consult a doctor immediately. Do not use mouth to mouth resuscitation if the victim ingested or inhaled the chemical.

Following skin contact

Take off contaminated clothing immediately. Wash off with soap and plenty of water. Consult a doctor.

4.3 Indication of immediate medical attention and special treatment needed, if necessary

Airway protection. Ensure that a clear airway exists. Intubate the patients and aspirate the secretions with a large-bore suction device if necessary. Administer oxygen by mechanically assisted pulmonary ventilation if respiration is depressed. Improve tissue oxygenation as much as possible before administering atropine, so as to minimize the risk of ventricular fibrillation. In severe poisonings, it may be necessary to support pulmonary ventilation mechanically for several days. Organophosphate pesticides

12.2 Persistence and degradability

AEROBIC: A dissipation half-life of 1 to 1.5 weeks was measured for isazophos in soil columns(1). In a field study, less than 10%, 39%, and 33% of the applied isazophos remained after 3 weeks for plots which had been previously treated for 2, 1, and 0 years, respectively(2). The higher rate of degradation in the soil showing 10% remaining was attributed to the higher pH of the soil found in that plot. No lag was seen in plots exposed to isazophos for the first time(4). However, after 10 weeks, more than one-third of the original

compound was still present in soil exposed for the first time while less than 10% remained in soils which had been previously treated. 5-Chloro-1-isopropyl-3-triazolol (CGA-17193) was reported as a metabolite(2). In laboratory studies, sorption coefficients were negatively correlated with isazophos degradation rates in soil(2). Only 25-50% of the originally applied isazophos remained after 1 week and only 5 to 20% remained after 4 weeks in an experiment using both a sandy and a sandy loam soil(3). A primary metabolite, designated as CGA 17193, was present as 30 to 60% of the original radioactivity after 1 week and remained in this range throughout the study(3). The metabolite appears to have greater soil mobility and greater resistance to degradation than the parent compound(3).

12.3 Bioaccumulative potential

An estimated BCF of 170 was calculated for isazofos(SRC), using a log Kow of 3.82(1) and a regression-derived equation(2). According to a classification scheme(3), this BCF suggests the potential for bioconcentration in aquatic organisms is high(SRC).

12.4 Mobility in soil

Koc values of 52.9, 91.3, 139, and 385 have been reported for isazofos in sand (pH 6.5, 0.9% organic matter), sandy loam (pH 8.5, 1.0% om), clay (pH 5.9, 4.8% om), and silt loam (pH 7.5, 1.0% om)(1). According to a classification scheme(2), Koc values in the ranges of 50-150 and 150-500 indicate high and moderate mobility, respectively. In a study using 1.2 meter deep soil monolith lysimeters with a turf cover, isazofos was not detected (detection limit=16 ug/l) in the percolate during the study, Sept 1991-Oct 1993(3). Isazofos was determined to be mobile in a Kentucky bluegrass turf managed as a golf course fairway(4).

13.1 Disposal methods

Product

The material can be disposed of by removal to a licensed chemical destruction plant or by controlled incineration with flue gas scrubbing. Do not contaminate water, foodstuffs, feed or seed by storage or disposal. Do not discharge to sewer systems.

Contaminated packaging

Containers can be triply rinsed (or equivalent) and offered for recycling or reconditioning. Alternatively, the packaging can be punctured to make it unusable for other purposes and then be disposed of in a sanitary landfill.
